## DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYES:

- 1. That under the terms of the Agreement with the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company, the Carrier improperly contracted out work coming within the scope of Agreement, effective January 1, 1945, Amended June 1, 1952, which consisted of building two (2) new cump trailers by an outside shop.
- 2. That accordingly the Carrier be ordered to discontinue contracting out work covered by the existing Agreement and additionally compensate the following employes:
