DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYES:

- (1) That under the current agreement the Carrier improperly assigned other than members of the Machinist Organization to operate Car Brass Boring Machines at Minneapolis, Minnesota.
- (2) That accordingly the Carrier be ordered to additionally compensate Machinist Charles Sundt eight (8) hours' pay at time and one-half rate for August 10, 1955 and for eight (8) hours' pay at time and one-half rate each day thereafter that other than members of the Machinist Craft are assigned to operate Car Brass Boring Machines at Minneapolis.

STATEMENT: The above question was submitted to the Second Division of the National Railroad Adjustment Board by the above referred to organization in ex parte form, a hearing thereon was held, and the Division is now in receipt of a request from the employes that the case be withdrawn.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
