1. That under the Current Agreement, Service Attendant C. G. Washington was unjustly dismissed from service by Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company at South Louisville Shops, Louisville, Kentucky on August 20, 1974, and after a summary investigation on August 1, 1974.
2. That accordingly, the Carrier be ordered to restore Service Attendant C. G. Washington to service with his seniority rights unimpaired compensated for all lost time at pro-rata rate of pay, paid for any and all Health and Welfare benefits lost plus vacation lost, effective August 20, 1974.
