Dispute: Claim of Employes:

1. That Laborer E. S. Stitts was unjustly disciplined for ninety working days from 7:00 a.m. March 22, 1977 and ending July 26, 1977 at 7:00 a.m.
2. That accordingly the Illinois Central Gulf Railroad be ordered to compensate Laborer E. S. Stitts for all time lost, and that all benefits be allowed during that period.

Findings:

The Second Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds that:

The carrier or carriers and the employe or employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employe within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act as approved June 21, 1934.

This Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein.

Parties to said dispute waived right of appearance at hearing thereon.

This case involves the disciplinary suspension of Claimant following hearing and investigation in which he was found guilty of "engaging in fisticuffs in the cab of locomotive 9422 on Wednesday, March 2, 1977 at or about 12:45 pm at Johnston Roundhouse, Memphis, Tennessee". The record establishes persuasively that Claimant punched C. R. Ferguson in the mouth while the two of them were alone in the cab of a locomotive at Johnston Roundhouse. That incident was an escalation, by Claimant, of a verbal exchange he and Ferguson had had a couple of days before. Carrier has proven Claimant guilty as charged and the penalty is not excessive in the circumstance.


