Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That under the current Agreement, Mechanical Department Electrician D. L. Muston was unjustly treated when his discipline record was assessed sixty (60) demerits on December 16, 1980, following formal investigation for alleged violation of portion of Rule "M" of the General Rules and Regulations of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company (Pacific Lines). Said alleged violation occurring on November 6, 1980.
2. That accordingly, the Southern Pacific Transportation Company (Pacific Lines) be ordered to:
  - (a) Rescind the sixty (60) demerits assessed Electrician D. L. Muston's discipline record.

Statement:


