Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company violated the provisions of Article II, Section 3, of the August 21, 1954 National Agreement when they refused to pay Carman J. Mickle for the Holiday pay due him from the Fourth of July Holiday, July 4, 1983.

2. That the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company be ordered to pay Carman J. Mickle in the amount of eight (8) hours pay at the applicable rate for the Holiday of July 4, 1983.

Statement:

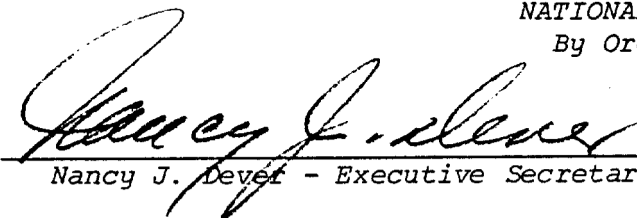
