DEPARTMENT, A. F. OF L. (BOILERMAKERS)**

MISSOURI PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY

DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYES: That under Award No. 316, Docket No. 317, National Railroad Adjustment Board, Second Division, the oldest furloughed boilermakers on the Missouri Pacific Railroad are claimants under above decision and should be compensated for time lost from May 2, 1938, to October 1, 1938, inclusive, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, at 86 cents per hour, except such days as were allowed claimant Walter Adams, boilermaker of Bush, Illinois.

STATEMENT: The above question was submitted to the Second Division of the National Railroad Adjustment Board by the above referred to organization in ex parte form, a hearing thereon was held, and the Division is now in receipt of request from the employees that the case be withdrawn.
