DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYES:

1. That under the current agreement the Carrier improperly assigned carmen helpers (oilers) to inspect cars for worn brass, waste grab, cut and rough journals.

2. That accordingly the Carrier be ordered to compensate the following car inspectors for a 4 hour call at the applicable carmen's rate for each date shown following their name account the aforementioned violation:
