DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYES:

- 1. The Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha Railway Company, hereinafter referred to as the Carrier, on November 30, 1955, Deember 5, 6, 7, 8, 14, 16, 19 and 21, 1955 elected to assign Carmen to remove three gasoline engines on motorcars at the Sioux City Motor Car Shops, work which is classed as Machinist work in the current Shop Crafts Agreement, Rule 58, while Machinist Elmer Peterson, hereinafter referred to as claimant, holding seniority in said department, was available for call.
- 2. The Carrier be ordered to pay time claims filed in due form on behalf of Machinist Elmer Peterson.
