PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

**SYSTEM FEDERATION NO. 114, RAILWAY EMPLOYEES'
DEPARTMENT, AFL-CIO (Electrical Workers)**

**SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY
(Pacific Lines)**

DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYEES:

1. That the Southern Pacific Company violated Article 2, Sections (6) A, G, of the February 4, 1965 Agreement in addition to Rule 6 (a) of the September 1, 1949 Agreement.

2. That accordingly, the Southern Pacific Company compensate Electrician T. P. Martin an additional eight (8) hours at the rate of time and one-half for having been required to work on his birthday, May 30, 1966, which was denied.

FINDINGS: The Second Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds that:

The carrier or carriers and the employee or employees involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employee within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act as approved June 21, 1934.

This Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein.

Parties to said dispute waived right of appearance at hearing thereon.

Claimant was required to work eight hours on Memorial Day, which was not only a holiday, but also his birthday. He received eight hours' pay for the holiday, as well as a like amount for his birthday and eight hours' pay at the time and one-half rate for working on that day.

Petitioner contends that Claimant is entitled to another payment at the time and one-half rate since he performed work on both his birthday and the Holiday. We disagree. The parties plainly anticipated this specific situation in Article II, Section 6 (f) of their February 4, 1965, Agreement, which provides that "If an employee's birthday falls on one of the seven holidays named in Article III of the Agreement of August 19, 1960, he may

by giving reasonable notice to his supervisor, have the following day or the day immediately preceding the first day during which he is not scheduled to work following such holiday considered as his birthday for the purposes of this Section."

Claimant did not exercise his option to celebrate his birthday on a date other than Memorial Day, and there is no sound basis here for awarding duplicate payments for the same eight hours' work.

In line with Award 5218 and the many other awards cited therein that have passed upon precisely the same issue and rules as are now before us, the present claim will be denied.

AWARD

Claim denied.
