PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

**SYSTEM FEDERATION NO. 76, RAILWAY EMPLOYEES'
DEPARTMENT, AFL-CIO (Electrical Workers)
CHICAGO, MILWAUKEE, ST. PAUL AND PACIFIC
RAILROAD COMPANY**

DISPUTE: CLAIM OF EMPLOYEES:

1. That the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company violated the agreement of February 4, 1965, when it refused to pay birthday-holiday pay to Electrician Herman Jenders in the amount of eight (8) hours at the pro rata rate for July 16, 1965.
2. That accordingly, the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company be ordered to compensate Herman Jenders in the amount of eight (8) hours at pro rata rate for July 16, 1965.

FINDINGS: The Second Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds that:

The carrier or carriers and the employe or employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employe within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act as approved June 21, 1934.

This Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein.

Parties to said dispute waived right of appearance at hearing thereon.

The fundamental issue involved in this case is the same as that considered in Docket No. 5248, which arose out of a like dispute under the same Agreement. Accordingly, we find our Award 5468 controlling in this case, despite variations in dates, parties, names and locations, which do not warrant repetitive discussion.

AWARD

Claim is denied.
