Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company violated the controlling agreement, particularly Rule 94 when on May 23, 1976, Sheet Metal Worker E. N. Cathy's position was blanked and Electrician J. C. Harris was assigned the duties of cutting Engine 663, added Engine 835 on K.O.X., made brake test and sander test, connected Engine 909 to B.T.X., made brake and sander test, disconnected 431 and connected Engine 822 and made brake and sander test in Diesel Shops, Memphis, Tennessee.
2. That accordingly, the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company be ordered to compensate Sheet Metal Worker Don Davidson for eight (8) hours at the pro rata rate of pay for such violation.

Findings:

The Second Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds that:

The carrier or carriers and the employe or employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employe within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act as approved June 21, 1934.

This Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein.

Parties to said dispute waived right of appearance at hearing thereon.

The facts in this claim are essentially the same as those in Award No. 8004. Accordingly, the findings in Award No. 8004 will govern here.


