

Parties to Dispute: ( International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers  
( Missouri Pacific Railroad Company

Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company violated Rules 3, 4 - Section 1 (a), 5 (a), 6 (a) and (b), 7 (a), (d) and (g) of the Communications Agreement effective August 1, 1977 when they denied Communications Maintainer C. Legamaro at St. Louis, Missouri the overtime provisions of the Agreement, i.e., four and seven-tenths hours (4.7') at the overtime rate for work performed outside his bulletined hours - 9:30 p.m. to 11:30 p.m., May 28, 1978, and a holiday 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., May 29, 1978.
2. That, accordingly, the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company be ordered to compensate Communications Maintainer C. Legamaro four and seven-tenths hours (4.7') at the overtime rate for May 28, and 29, 1978.

Statement:

The above question was submitted to the Second Division of the National Railroad Adjustment Board by the above referred to organization in ex parte form, hearing thereon was waived, and the Division is now in receipt of a request from the employees that the case be withdrawn.


