Strickland, Service Attendant, be restored to his regular assignment at South Louisville Shops with all seniority unimpaired, vacation, health and welfare, hospital and life insurance be paid and compensated for all lost time, effective January 5, 1979, and the payment of 6% interest rate added thereto.

Statement:


