Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company violated NOTE to Rule 5 of the June 1, 1960 controlling agreement when they denied Electricians J. C. Bussard, L. B. Morris, G. G. Lonon, V. E. Herbert, and D. L. Crawford their contractual rights to five (5) days notice regarding the holiday, January 1, 1981, at Kansas City, Missouri.
2. That, accordingly, Carrier be ordered to compensate each Claimant, Electricians J. C. Bussard, L. B. Morris, G. G. Lonon, V. E. Herbert, and D. L. Crawford, five (5) days, eight (8) hours each day, December 27 through December 31, 1980 at pro-rata rate for having been deprived their contractual rights under the NOTE to Rule 5.


Statement:
