Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad Company violated the controlling agreement, in particular Rule 32, when Electrician O. J. Jones was unjustly dismissed from service on February 4, 1981, at Hialeah, Florida.
2. That accordingly, the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad Company compensate Electrician O. J. Jones in the amount of eight (8) hours per day at the pro rata rate for the period commencing February 4, 1981 and ending the day he is reinstated to his position as Electrician at Hialeah, Florida, both dates inclusive. In addition Electrician O. J. Jones be allowed all other benefits that accrue to his position.


Statement:
