

Parties to Dispute: ( International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers  
( Southern Pacific Transportation Company (Pacific Lines)

Dispute: Claim of Employees:

1. That under the current Agreement, Mechanical Department Electrician I. R. Bias was unjustly treated when he was dismissed from service on December 30, 1980, following investigation for alleged violation of portions of Rules 810 and "G" of the General Rules and Regulations of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company (Pacific Lines). Said alleged violation occurring on December 15, 16, and 17, 1980.
2. That accordingly, the Southern Pacific Transportation Company (Pacific Lines) be ordered to:
  - (a) Restore Electrician I. R. Bias to service with all rights unimpaired including service and seniority, loss of wages, vacation, payment of hospital and medical insurance, group disability insurance, railroad retirement contributions, and the loss of wages to include interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum.

Statement:


