1. That the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company violated the controlling Agreement by transferring Carman Apprentice M. Eisenhower from the former Chicago and Eastern Illinois Railroad Company property at Mitchell, Illinois to the St. Louis Terminal at a higher rate of pay and allowed to bring the car apprentice time he had served at Mitchell, Illinois to the St. Louis Terminal.

That the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company make the following Car Apprentices whole by allowing the same rate of pay allowed Mr. Eisenhower and requiring him to serve 757 days apprenticeship the same as them.
