

Parties to Dispute: (International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers
(Seaboard System Railroad Company)

Dispute: Claim of Employees:

- 1) That the Seaboard System Railroad Company (SCL) violated the controlling agreement, in particular, Rules 93 and 26(a) at Pinoca Shops, Charlotte, North Carolina, beginning September 10, 1983 when Mr. B. R. Jordan was furloughed and the electrical work transferred to the Supervisor F. A. Lunsden and Machinist Hoyt Green.
- 2) That accordingly, the Seaboard System Railroad Company (SCL) compensate Mr. Jordan eight (8) hours each day at the pro rata rate for this continuous claim, until he is restored to service at Pinoca Shops and allowed to perform the electrical work now being performed by other than Electricians.


Statement:
