STATEMENT OF CLAIM:

"Claim that L. J. Powers and C. C. Phillips had the right to decline employment at Augusta, Georgia without loss of protection under Article I of the September 25, 1964 Agreement. File 17(93-828)"

FINDINGS:

The Second Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds that:

The carrier or carriers and the employee or employees involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employee within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act as approved June 21, 1934.

This Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein.

Parties to said dispute waived right of appearance at hearing thereon.

Except as to different Claimants and the fact that Claimants did not accept the transfers offered by the Carrier, this dispute is based on the same arguments as in Second Division Award 13009, and the Board reaches the same conclusion. A monetary remedy is appropriate. Such was not the case in Award 13009.

AWARD

Claim sustained.
