STATEMENT OF CLAIM: "Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employes on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railway, under the provisions of Rule 76, in behalf of Mr. L. R. Lehr, cashier, local freight office, Trenton, Mo., rate \$147.20 per month, for pay for period July 7th, to July 20th, 1938, a total of twelve (12) working days, while he was away from his position on vacation."
