PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS

THE CHESAPEAKE AND OHIO RAILWAY COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of the Order of Railroad Telegraphers on Chesapeake and Ohio Railway, that—

(1) during the period beginning January 14, 1941, in which the starting time of the three shifts in the continuously operated telegraph office at Maysville, Kentucky, was changed from 6:00 A. M., 2:00 P. M., and 10:00 P. M., respectively, to 7:00 A. M., 3:00 P. M., and 11:00 P. M., the arriving time of train No. 1 due at Maysville at 6:58 A. M., for which the Third Trick telegrapher, E. N. Reed, whose reassigned hours were 11:00 P. M. to 7:00 A. M., was required to sell tickets, made it impossible for him to check his ticket stock, count his cash, and transfer same to the relieving telegrapher before 7:00 A. M. each day; and that:

(2) overtime necessarily worked each day by Telegrapher Reed after 7:00 A. M., because of this rearrangement of hours, shall be paid for under Rule 29 of the Telegraphers' Agreement.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board jointly by the parties;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That hearing thereon has been held but not concluded. Under date of January 4, 1943, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
