PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS THE PENNSYLVANIA RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on The Pennsylvania Railroad, that Block-Operator C. H. Smith, required to work March 24th and 31st, 1942, the seventh consecutive work days on the second trick at "HG" Langdon, is entitled to time and one-half under the provisions of Regulation 4-B-4 of the Telegraphers' Agreement, Part 2, for working the seventh day which the Carrier was obligated to assign as his relief day.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of February 7, 1944, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division withdrawing this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
