PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, PACIFIC LINES

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on the Southern Pacific Company, Pacific Lines, that (1) under Rule 2 (b) of the effective agreement, the hourly rate for the position of Agent-telegrapher at Eloy, Tucson Division, should have been fixed at the same rate as position of Agent-telegrapher at Red Rock;

- (2) That the rate for second and third telegraphers should have been fixed at 92ϕ per hour;
- (3) That such increases be effective as of February 17, 1942, the date on which operating change in conditions took place, and
- (4) Employes who have occupied either of these positions since February 17, 1942 be retroactively reimbursed accordingly.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of December 15, 1944, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division withdrawing this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
