THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS

**THE DELAWARE, LACKAWANNA & WESTERN RAILROAD
COMPANY**

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company that C. E. Folk, regularly assigned to a bulletined temporary vacancy on the agent-operator position at Minetto, New York, who was required, while so assigned to perform relief work on the clerk-operator position at Fulton, New York, August 27 through September 21, 1947, shall be paid for this emergency relief work under Rule 15 (a) of the Telegraphers' Agreement as follows:

- (a) \$1.00 per day arbitrary expense allowance on each of the twenty-one days required to work at Fulton.
- (b) Travel time in each direction between Minetto and Fulton.
- (c) Be paid the difference of \$233.09 he would have earned at Minetto in addition to what he actually earned at Fulton during the period involved.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held and under date of December 3, 1948, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Acting Secretary of the Third Division withdrawing this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
