STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim, as presented by the System Committee of the Brotherhood, that T. F. Dunlap and A. C. Long be paid eight hours at time and one-half rate on November 27, 1948, and subsequent dates, when ticket clerks and janitor are used to handle mail and baggage.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board, ex parte, by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of December 13, 1950, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Acting Secretary of the Third Division, requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
