PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS

THE NEW YORK CENTRAL RAILROAD COMPANY (Line West)

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee on the New York Central Railroad, Line West of Buffalo, that:

- 1. The Carrier violated the terms of the Agreement between the parties when it failed to call and assign Telegrapher R. M. Higley at Bellevue, Ohio, whose regular hours are 2:00 P. M., to 10:00 P. M., to perform the service required on his position, Saturday, June 21, 1952, a rest day; instead of calling H. G. Hurst, Agent-telegrapher, whose hours were 6:00 A. M., to 2:00 P. M.
- 2. Because of its failure to call Telegrapher R. M. Higley to perform the work aforesaid the Carrier shall compensate him on the basis of four (4) hours and forty-five (45) minutes at the time and one-half rate, as prescribed in the rules, the same as he would have received had he been called.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of February 21, 1956, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
