NATIONAL RAILROAD ADJUSTMENT BOARD THIRD DIVISION

PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES

LEHIGH AND NEW ENGLAND RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that the Carrier violated the rules of the Clerical Agreement:

- 1. When on July 7th, 1954, a notice was posted stating position of Billing Clerk, (incumbent, Howard Watkins) would be abolished effective with the tour of duty ending 5:30 P. M., E.S.T., July 15th, 1954, without conference or necessary negotiations under the provision of agreed upon rules.
- 2. That Howard Watkins, incumbent of position of Billing Clerk, prior to July 16, 1954 and all other employes displaced and adversely affected, namely; William Theodore, Thomas Mohon and Carl Barrall, be compensated for all monetary loss due to the improper actions of the Carrier as stated in Claim No. 1, and such monetary claim to continue until the Carrier re-establishes the position of Billing Clerk.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That carrier and employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of December 19, 1956, the parties jointly advised the Secretary of the Third Division of their desire to withdraw this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
