**BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS,
FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES**

THE BALTIMORE AND OHIO RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

(1) Carrier violated the Agreement on the freight platform at Dayton, Ohio, when it failed to call the senior regular tallymen and truckers for overtime opportunities preceding their regular starting time on January 7, 1954 and subsequent dates, and

(2) Effective January 7, 1954 and continuing in effect until such time as this grievance is properly adjudicated, all regular employees affected be compensated for all wage loss sustained due to the above-mentioned violation of the Clerks' Agreement, and

(3) That a joint check of the Carrier's records be made by the parties for the purpose of ascertaining the extent of the violation on January 7, 1954 and subsequent dates.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon, and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the carrier and the employees involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employees within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of March 12, 1957, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division, requesting withdrawal of this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
