### PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

# BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES

#### ILLINOIS CENTRAL RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that—

- (a) Carrier violated the Clerks' Agreement at the Passenger Station, Fort Dodge, Iowa, when on April 4, 1955, it unilaterally assigned clerical work theretofore attached to a clerical position to be performed by employes of Carrier occupying positions that are not included within the Scope Rule of its Agreement with the Brotherhood, revised as of February 1, 1954.
- (b) Ticket Clerk Position No. 264 be re-established with all duties attached thereto which were performed by the occupant thereof prior to April 4, 1955.
- (c) All clerical employes be compensated for wage losses sustained as a result of the abolishment of Position No. 264 at Fort Dodge, Iowa.
- NOTE: Reparation to be determined by joint check of Carrier's payroll other records.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon, and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the carrier and the employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of May 10, 1957, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary

of the Third Division, requesting withdrawal of this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

### AWARD

Case dismissed.
