# BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES

### MISSOURI PACIFIC RAILROAD — Gulf District

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- (1) Carrier violated the Clerks' Agreement when it failed and refused to allow W. H. Baylor, Porter, Austin, Texas, an additional day at overtime rate on May 30, 1957 (holiday), when he was on vacation and his position was filled, in accordance with the provisions of Article 7 (a) of the December 19, 1941 National Vacation Agreement.
- (2) That the Carrier shall be required to pay W. H. Baylor a punitive day's pay for the holiday, May 30, 1957.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That carrier and employe involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employe within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of March 9, 1960, the parties jointly advised the Secretary of the Third Division of their desire to withdraw this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.
