NATIONAL RAILROAD ADJUSTMENT BOARD THIRD DIVISION

PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS THE BALTIMORE AND OHIO RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, that:

- 1. Carrier violated the agreement between the parties hereto when on December 5, 6, 8 and 9, 1956, it caused, permitted and required train service employes not covered by the Telegraphers' Agreement to secure over the telephone from "MO" Tower, Clarksburg, permission from the operator at "MD" Tower, Clarksburg, West Virginia to enter the main track from yard tracks, permission to cross from one main track to another, figures on trains, and permission to enter the main track and proceed east to Grafton.
- 2. Carrier shall compensate an idle telegrapher (extra in preference) for pay for one day (8 hours) on each date hereinbefore listed.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of March 31, 1960, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
