PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS THE BALTIMORE AND OHIO RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, that:

- 1. Carrier violated the Agreement between the parties hereto when on April 16, 1957, it caused, required and permitted a train service employe not covered by the Telegraphers' Agreement, on Work Extra 6416, a work train in maintenance service, to report clear of the main track at Georgetown Junction for Train No. 4 at 11:25 A. M. to the operator at DS Tower, and at 11:57 A. M. to secure permission from the operator at DS Tower to occupy No. 2 track and proceed eastward at Georgetown Junction.
- 2. Carrier now be required to compensate an idle operator, extra in preference, for pay for one day on April 16, 1957, because of said violation at Georgetown Junction.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing was waived and under date of March 31, 1960, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
