PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

BROTHERHOOD OF MAINTENANCE OF WAY EMPLOYES

THE ATCHISON, TOPEKA AND SANTA FE RAILWAY CO.— Eastern Lines

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- (1) The Carrier violated the Agreement when it declined Paul E. Cordray's request of March 30, 1956 to exercise displacement rights to position of extra gang foreman.
- (2) Paul E. Cordray be allowed the difference between what he was paid as a section laborer and relief foreman and what he would have received had he been permitted to exercise the displacement rights referred to in Part (1) of this claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That carrier and employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of November 2, 1960, the parties jointly advised the Secretary of the Third Division of their desire to withdraw this case from further consideration by the Division which request is hereby granted.
