PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

(Southern Pacific Company (Pacific Lines)

STATEMENT OF CLAIM:

Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railrone Signalmen on the Southern Pacific Company that:

(a) The Southern Pacific Company violated the current Signalmen's Agrament effective April 1, 1947 (reprinted April 1, 1958 including revisions) when Failed and/or declined to apply the Scope Rule, which resulted in the violation of Rule 70, by assigning the recognized signal work of installing switch heaters to power operated and/or spring switches at Worden and Taxum, Oregon, Shasta Division to employes not covered by the Signalmen's Agreement.

(b) E. G. White, Signal Foreman; W. R. Anderson, Lead Signalman: C. 6 Mowdy and J. L. Brown, Signalmen, be allowed eight (8) hours each at their respective rates of pay for each of the following dates: November 30, December 1, C. C., 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 13 and 14, 1965. (Carrier's File: SIG 152-192)

OPTRION OF BOARD: The dispute arose when Carrier assigned other than signal employes to install switch heaters at various locations on its property.

The parties, the issues and the applicable gules are identical to those present in Award 19506, and for the reasons stated therein the claim will be denied.

While Petitioner argued before the Board that "it was necessary to remove the <u>rail braces</u> from the gauge plates, and the <u>roller spring hanger</u> from the stock rails", the Statement of Claim is limited to the work of installing these switch heaters, hence there is no issue before us concerning rail braces or roller hangers.

eTHDENG: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon, and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the Carrier and the Employes involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.

AWARD

Claim denied.
