PARTIES TO DISPUTE: (

(Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad: Company

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad Company that:

- (a) Carrier improperly classed Signal Maintainer M. D. Stowe as a disqualified sub-standard employe, and improperly required Stowe to sign a letter of understanding to that effect.
- (b) Carrier should remove the "disqualified sub-standard" classification from Mr. Stowe and remove the letter of understanding referred to in part (a) above from his Personal Record File. (Carrier's File: PR-M.D. Stowe)

OPINION OF BOARD: This claim is based upon the Carrier's classifying the Claimant as a "disqualified sub-standard employe" due to a health condition. The Claimant signed a letter concurring with the designation agreeing to retire at age 65.

We find no provision in the Agreement that prohibits the Carrier from classifying the Claimant in the **manner** described in this case.

The Claimant's retirement at age 65 is not at issue in that he is still in the service of the Carrier.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the **Employes** involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.
