(Burlington Northern Inc.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

(1) The Carrier violated the Agreement when it assigned the work of tuck pointing the record building at 12th and Canal Streets, Chicago, Illinois to outside forces (System File **15-3/MW-84(c)** 3-1-73).

(2) The Carrier further violated the Agreement **when** it did not give the General **Chairman** prior written notification of its plan to assign said tuck pointing work to outside forces.

(3) **B&B** Foreman R.J. Harris, Mason A. H. Hoppenstedt, Carpenters P. Jones, H. Cantu, Carpenter Helpers V. Rodriquez, B. T. Jenkins, D. Briggs and J. Miller each be allowed pay at their respective straight-time rates for an equal proportionate share of six hundred ninety-six (696) manhours expended by outside forces in performing the aforementioned work.

<u>OPINION OF BOARD</u>: The record demonstrates that tuck-pointing is not customarily performed by Carrier **employes** and Petitioner has failed in its burden of proof by not contending that such **work** was ever done by claimants, let alone customarily performed by than. Therefore **we** must deny the claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the **Employes** involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and **Employes** within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the **dispute** involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.

AWARD

Claim denied.
