control switches on the Signal 4400 volt transmission line near Tifton, **Ga.**,  
Tucker having loaded the mechanism at **9:30 a.m.** and unloaded it at Tifton,  
Ga., at **11:30 a.m.** /Carrier file: SG-98/

OPINION OF BOARD: For the reasons set forth in our Award 21635 and  
with particular reference to Third Division Awards  
10613 and 12188, we deny the claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board upon the whole  
record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the **Employees involved** in this dispute are  
respectively Carrier and **Employees** within the meaning of the Railway Labor  
Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over  
the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.
