STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen on the Kansas City Southern Railway Company:

In behalf of Signal Maintainer D. R. Troth that his record be cleared of any reference to the charges and compensate him for all monetary loss sustained September 30, through October 9, 1974. Carrier's File: 013.31-1627

OPINION OF BOARD: Claimant herein was charged with <u>refusal</u> to report for duty after being instructed by dispatcher (through an operator) to cover a switch failure. After hearing and investigation, Claimant was suspended ten days for <u>failure</u> to report for duty.

The Organization asserts that **Claimant** was charged with one offense and disciplined for **another**. **The** Board is of the opinion that the Organization's contention is without **merit**.

The underlying reasons for tie requirement that a charge be specific is to provide an employe and his representatives an opportunity to prepare a defense and to avoid surprise at a hearing. In this connection the terms "failure to report- and "refusing to report" are sufficiently synonymous so that the underlying reasons referred to above have been satisfied, and Claimant was not prejudiced thereby.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived *oral* hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employes involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

The Agreement was not violated.

A W A R D

Claim denied.
