PARTIES TO DISPUTE: (Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen  
(The Long Island Rail Road Company

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claims of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen on the Long Island Rail Road:

Claim No. 1 -- SG-19-75

On behalf of Signal Helper David Hamma for the Signalman rate of pay for driving a truck on March 19, 20, 21, 24, April 4, 23, 24, 25, 28, 29, May 6, 7, 8 & 9, 1975.

Claim No. 2 -- SG-40-75

On behalf of Signal Helper Samuel Racciops for the Signalman rate of pay for driving a truck on June 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 16, 17, 20 & 25, 1975.

OPINION OF BOARD: The facts in this case are virtually identical to those in Award 21.677 involving the same parties. We find the rationale and opinion of that decision directly applicable here. Therefore we must deny this Claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employees involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employees within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

The Agreement was not violated.

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Claim are denied.
