PARTIES TO DISPUTE: (

(The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood (GL-8823) that:

- (1) The Carrier violated the **terms** of the **Agreement** between **the** Parties **when**, on **March** 23, 1977, it imposed **discipline** of **15 days' suspension** from service **upon Yard** Clerk G. **A**.Miller as a **result** of au **investigation** held **March** 9, 1977, and
- (2) The Carrier shall, **as** a result, be required to **compensate** Mr. G. A.Miller fifteen **(15)** days' pay at the rata of his position for the period March 29, 1977 through April 13, 1977.

OPINION OF BOARD: Notwithstanding the Organization's contentions on the record to the contrary, the Carrier has met its obligation to establish that the Claimant was in a company vehicle on the premises with intoxicating beverages in his possession -- all without authority and in violation of applicable Rules. Additionally, the record supports the Carrier's claim that the hearing was properly conducted. As to the extent of the discipline assessed, considering the seriousness of the infraction, we find no basis to mitigate the suspension as assessed.

FINDINGS: The Third **Division** of the Adjustment Board, **upon** the **whole** record and all the evidence, finds **and holds**:

That the **parties** waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employee involved in thin **dispute** are respectively Carrier and **Employes** within **the** meaning of the **Railway Labor** Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.

A W A R D

Claim denied.
