STATEMENT OF CLAIM: "Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- (1) The ten (10) days of suspension imposed upon Track Foreman Paul Simons for 'allegedly changing your testimony as given to Patrolman Richard Bowes on October 22, 1979, regarding the whereabouts and activities of Boon Truck Driver, James Oliver, on August 28, 1979, as subsequently given to the District Attorney on April 3, 1980' and for 'alleged violation of Rule D, subparagraph 3' was arbitrary, capricious, unwarranted and on the basis of unproven charges (System Docket No. NH-49).
- (2) The claimant's record shall be cleared and he shall be compensated for all wage loss suffered."

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waivedoral hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employes involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934:

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.

AWARD

Claim denied.
