




CARRIER MEMBERS' RESPONSE

The Dissent would have one believe the "facts" were not in dispute. Such assertion, however, is sorely tried when one observes the 45 page document submitted by the Organization setting forth its version of the facts, the nine page document submitted by the Carrier setting forth a totally different version of the facts, and the nine page Submission of the interested third party disputing the Organization's factual assertions.


