Baublitz, for five and one-half hours at their respective straight time rate of pay for each day worked from September 4, 2001, to September 7, 2001, account Carrier violated the current Signalmen's Agreement, particularly Rule 41, when it changed their working hours on Gang EO92 from 6:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., to 9:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m., and then failed to compensate the Claimants with the proper amount of pay. Carrier's File No. NEC-BRS(S)-SD-943. General Chairman's File No. JY321086-650111. BRS File Case No. 12277-NRPC(S)."

#### FINDINGS:

The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds that:
