STATEMENT OF CLAIM.-

"Claim of the System Board of Adjustment, Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employes, that position of Port Clerk, rate, \$6.03 per day, be established, bulletined, and assigned to an employe at the Stockton Freight Station of the Southern Pacific Company (Pacific Lines), and that the successful applicant be compensated retroactively to May 1, 1936."

FINDINGS.—The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds that:
The dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party;
