STATEMENT OF CLAIM.—

"Claim of the System Board of Adjustment, Southern Pacific Lines, Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employes, that Norman Cock, Car Desk Clerk at the Los Angeles Freight Station, should be paid at rate of time and one half for Sunday, December 11, 1932, and for each and every Sunday subsequent thereto on which he has been required to work."
