STATEMENT OF CLAIM.—

"Claim of Sam Boatman, R. M. Brown, Henry Cox, Andrew Dudley, Robert Davis, and Floyd Collins, storehouse employees, Knoxville, Tennessee, for seniority in Class 'B,' as of dates shown below:

"Sam Boatman, August 12, 1918.

"R. M. Brown, December 8, 1919.

"Henry Cox, August 19, 1918.

"Andrew Dudley, August 17, 1909.

"Robert Davis, December 15, 1919.

"Floyd Collins, October 20, 1918."

FINDINGS.—The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon, and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the carrier and the employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That hearing on this dispute was concluded February 10, 1937. Under dates of July 9 and 12, 1937, the parties advised the Secretary of the Third Division of their desire to withdraw it from further consideration by the Division, which requests are hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
