DISPUTE: "Claim for reinstatement of rate of \$132.50 per month on position of yard clerk at Trenton, Mo., and all employes assigned to such position be paid the difference between \$114.50 per month and \$132.50 per month since January 19, 1933."

The dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party.
