Middletown, Ralph David, Austin Chenault, Tom Biggs, Glen Likins, Edward Ratzlaff, Memmo Wedel, Ray Grantz, George Warsters, Kenneth Webster, Jack Rauch, and Harvey Wedel extra gang laborers employed in steel gang on the El Paso-Amarillo Division, dismissed from the service on account of declining to board in the commissary outfit, for reimbursement for time lost."
