NATIONAL RAILROAD ADJUSTMENT BOARD THIRD DIVISION

PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

BROTHERHOOD OF MAINTENANCE OF WAY EMPLOYES LOS ANGELES UNION PASSENGER TERMINAL

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood:

- (a) That new position of Yard Track Foreman was established effective May 22, 1939, at Los Angeles Union Passenger Terminal, and in accordance with provisions of the Wage Schedule basic monthly rate of \$142.20 was applicable to such position.
- (b) That Mr. W. G. Magruder and Mr. C. K. Porter, who were assigned to fill position of Yard Track Foreman for various dates between May 22, 1939, and January 5, 1940, receive adjustment in wages to cover the difference between the rate they were paid as Assistant Track Foreman, 59 cents per hour, and basic monthly rate of \$142.20 for such days as each filled position of Yard Track Foreman.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of July 22, 1943, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of the case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
